COMMUNITY HEALTH ADVANCEMENTS

Dear friends, colleagues, community, and neighbors,

It is such an exciting time to be involved in the healthcare delivery system in the Central Valley. I am tremendously grateful to Saint Agnes Medical Center, Trinity Health and the entire community for the opportunity be a part of, and witness to, all the great efforts being put forth that extend our healing mission.

Implementing the Epic electronic medical record was a huge step for Saint Ages Medical Center toward integrating the area's healthcare activities. We now have the ability to seamlessly communicate among and between our healthcare colleagues outside of Saint Agnes. This benefits patients and providers alike by cutting down unnecessary testing and expediting plans of care. We have plans to build a new, more efficient, and comfortable Emergency Room. Mobile healthcare has been introduced to reach out to patients who do not have the resources or ability to come to us. Fresno County residents can now benefit from the new Rural Mobile Health Program, which offers medical services at no cost to agricultural workers and residents living in the rural communities of Fresno County to improve health and prevent disease. As part of this program, UCSF-Fresno, and Fresno State's Mobile Health Unit in collaboration with Saint Agnes Medical Center will be delivering these medical services with their mobile health units, along with Fresno County's Community Health Worker (CHW) Network to provide wraparound care coordination services to residents.

Our Residency program has grown and expanded to include new disciplines. Many of the graduates are realizing that the Central Valley is a great place to live, work and raise a family. Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion has been intentionally incorporated across our system of care by Trinity Health and Saint Agnes leadership – especially into the workplace. I had the honor of speaking at the Black Maternal Health week conference. Ideas were exchanged, new approaches were learned, and health equity can be a reality. We celebrated Hospital Week, participated in the Black Nurses Association Lunch, Nurses Week and Juneteenth: Strides for Freedom. Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion are part of our Core Values. DEI values and mission leadership are provided during new employee orientation. And our Language Line services are expanded to provide linguistically competent healthcare for our patients.

Saint Agnes Medical Center also sponsored several healthcare updates to the community regarding common and notso-common maladies. We held career fairs targeting a wide array of healthcare opportunities.

Saint Agnes Medical Center is an advocate for patients and will continue to participate in assuring high quality delivery of healthcare. Our message, along with all of Trinity Health asks Congress to work to influence the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) in providing a payment adjustment for hospitals that addresses Medicare underpayment; improve Medicare rates and stop future cuts; and oppose efforts by drug companies to impose more restrictions that will harm access. These efforts all have a direct positive impact on our own community and will assure growth in what we provide and confidence in what we do.

Again, my thanks for the opportunity to be part of this great community and to all who join us in our mission.

HEALTH PROFESSIONS EDUCATION

In keeping with Trinity Health's values of Commitment to those who are poor, Saint Agnes focused on implementing strategies to address access to health within its service area which is marked by a higher population who are either uninsured or receiving Medi-Cal. The Saint Agnes service area also faces challenges in meeting the medical needs of its population due to a lower number of primary care physicians. Together as a system, it is the program's mission to provide high-quality, compassionate health care services.

In fiscal year 2023, Saint Agnes provided more than 100 thousand hours and invested more than \$17.5 million to train 72 physicians, 1,176 nurses and nursing students, and 1,623 non-nurse health professionals in an environment of diversity, equity, and inclusivity that welcomes all people regardless of background in the hopes of inspiring new ways of thinking, behaving, and caring.

In June, Saint Agnes colleagues, physicians and leadership extended a warm Saint Agnes welcome to **54 new physician residents and fellows**.

This marked the sixth class for Internal Medicine, Family Medicine welcomed its fifth, Emergency Medicine and Transitional Year programs welcomed their third, and Sports Medicine and Hospice and Palliative Medicine welcomed their first class of fellows

Valley family enjoys life-saving care

Pulmonary embolism treatment gets an upgrade

In November 2022, Clifford Drum was having shortness of breath and felt dizzy. He knew something was wrong. Thanks to Saint Agnes' NEW Pulmonary Embolism Response Team (PERT) – the first in the Valley – Clifford was able to receive the care he needed right here in Fresno.

"The ambulance came in. The fire department came through. They thought because of the pressure on the chest...like heart attack," Clifford says. "The EMT, she says, 'I don't think so. I think you've probably got a blood clot.'"

A pulmonary embolism is the third leading cause of cardiovascular death after heart attack and stroke. It's often difficult to diagnose because the symptoms look like other medical conditions.

All in the family

Three months later, Clifford's daughter-in-law, Teresa Drum, began experiencing similar symptoms. Tests revealed that she too was suffering from a clot that had traveled to her lungs.

"I had a thyroidectomy in January, and then I noticed my ankle swelling. There was a lot of burning in my calf," Teresa says. "I remembered Clifford's story and thought to myself, 'I'm too young to have that.'"

A week later, Teresa noticed she was having difficulty breathing, but it wasn't until she

nearly passed out while standing up from a chair that she realized something was critically wrong and went to Saint Agnes.

Amazingly enough, the same team at Saint Agnes that helped Clifford performed the same procedure on Teresa and, thankfully, she enjoyed the same life-saving result.

The PERT difference

In an effort to improve the diagnosis and treatment of these conditions, Saint Agnes has joined leading hospitals across the country in developing the Central Valley's first multidisciplinary Pulmonary Embolism Response Team (PERT).

Our multimodal treatment approach includes conservative medical management, systematic lysis, and catheter-directed treatment such as thrombectomy and thrombolysis. Recent data suggests that the combination of a PERT team and thrombectomy can reduce risk by 90 percent in pulmonary embolism patients.

A breath of relief

Following the procedure, both Clifford and Teresa noticed an immediate improvement in their breathing. "You immediately feel like you can breathe again," Teresa says. "I got back to my room, and I was like, 'Okay, that's what that's supposed to feel like."

"I couldn't ask for anything better," Clifford says.
"As far as I'm concerned, they saved my life."

COMMUNITY HEALTH RECOGNITIONS

Our 2023 Patient Safety Excellent Award from Healthgrades proves once again that Saint Agnes is a leading hospital in the nation in patient safety. With safety being one of our core values and a top priority, we are excited to be recognized for the fifth year in a row.

Our Patient Safety distinction places Saint Agnes among the top 5% of all short-term acute care hospitals reporting patient safety data as evaluated by Healthgrades – the leading marketplace connecting patients and providers.

In Fiscal Year 2023, Saint Agnes Medical Center was also named a Blue Distinction Center+ for Cardiac Care, as a part of the Blue Distinction Specialty Care program.

Blue Distinction Centers are nationally designated providers that show expertise in delivering improved patient safety and better health outcomes, based on objective measures that were developed with input from the medical community and leading accreditation and quality organizations.

To receive a Blue Distinction Centers+ designation, hospitals must demonstrate expertise in delivering safe and effective cardiac care, focusing on cardiac valve surgery, coronary artery bypass graft (CABG), and percutaneous coronary interventions (PCI) episodes of care. Hospitals receiving a Blue Distinction Centers+ designation must also demonstrate better cost-efficiency compared to their peers.

We are incredibly proud of every member on our cardiac team for providing exceptional care for our patients. This award is a direct reflection of your dedication and hard work. Thank you for making Saint Agnes one of the best! Saint Agnes recognized for cardiac care.



COMMUNITY BENEFIT IMPACT

Saint Agnes Medical Center's Community Health and Well-Being (CHWB) strategy promotes optimal health for those who are poor and vulnerable in the communities. We serve by connecting social and clinical care, addressing social needs, dismantling systemic racism and reducing health inequities. Many Saint Agnes members are unable to follow their medical care plans because of non-medical barriers such as lack of financial resources, insurance, or transit. Through these efforts, Saint Agnes served about 173,000 individuals and their families.



Improving Access to Care

On Tuesday, February 14, the Fresno County Department of Public Health (FCDPH) launched the Rural Mobile Health program. The Fresno County Board of Supervisors allocated \$5.2 million dollars of ARPA funds for a 2-year program. As a part of this program, UCSF Fresno, Saint Agnes and Fresno State's Mobile Health Unit will provide medical services at no cost to agricultural workers and residents living in the rural areas of Fresno County.

Community Health Workers (CHWs) will also assist the mobile health events by providing education on various health related topics and help individuals connect with nearby primary care providers and social resources. The Rural Mobile Health program aims to make healthcare access more equitable for people living in the rural areas of Fresno County.

At the inaugural event at Terranova Ranch in Helm, California, community leaders – including Saint Agnes' own Ivonne Der Torosian (Vice President of Community Health and Well-Being) and Dr. Michael Moya (Family Medicine Residency Program Director) – spoke about the importance of health equity and access to quality care for residents throughout the county.

In the fiscal year 2023, Saint Agnes invested more than \$56,000 and provided care to nearly 300 people.

Neighborhood Safety

TCI is an innovative funding and technical assistance initiative, in partnership with Trinity Health, its Regional Health Ministries (RHM), community-based organizations and residents, that is striving to advance health and racial equity in our communities experiencing high poverty and other vulnerabilities. TCI investments are focused in 10 communities of color experiencing significant poverty across our Trinity Health footprint. Each RHM receiving TCI funding will collaborate with a multi-sector collaborative to develop and implement evidence-based strategies that advance health and racial equity through addressing at least one root cause of poor health identified in the most recent Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) Implementation Strategy.

In Fresno, Saint Agnes is funding Fresno Housing to work within the 93706 community of West Fresno and collaborate with residents living in the California Avenue Neighborhoods. With the help of the Community Justice Network, we are committed to shifting toward a community-centered public safety model designed to ensure the safety of all Fresno residents.

Aligned events

May 6th, 2023 - CAN Street Mural

West Fresno's California Avenue Neighborhood Initiative created history this year with the installation of the first and largest street mural in the City of Fresno. The mural represents a "celebration of all the things that have happened that support sound and stable neighborhoods", said Tyrone Roderick Williams, CEO of Fresno Housing. With the collaborative effort of our partners, we will continue the creation and ongoing maintenance of this community project and the promotion of safety in Southwest Fresno.

Starting in March 2023 - 93706 Market

Bridging access means creating opportunities for residents to celebrate where they live. The 93706 Market was a series of farmers markets that showcased cultural heritage through themed awareness months, powerful community engagement, and local venders aiming to increase the availability of nutritious foods in areas with limited access offered within the heart of the agricultural industry in the Central Valley.



Navigating to Health

Fulfilling our mission to improve the health of our community and serve those in need, Saint Agnes continued its support of the Health Hub, and Substance Use Navigator programs. Both programs address social and clinical issues that impede good health. The evidence-based program takes a comprehensive approach to health care, in which caregivers treat clinical problems while Community Health Workers focus on identifying, defining and resolving social issues. As a result of this collaboration, patients achieve more successful outcomes. Our Substance Use Navigator program provided 404 patients experiencing substance use disorder with connections to care. Community Health Workers assisted 3,737 people in connecting to 5,459 medical and social care services. Top needs include:

Holy Cross Center for Health and Wellness

Operated by Saint Agnes Medical Center in with the Sisters of the Holy Cross for more than 25 years, Holy Cross Center for Women in downtown Fresno served as a day respite and learning center for homeless and low-income women and their children. In Fiscal Year 2022, Saint Agnes Medical Center partnered with WestCare California to redefine the Holy Cross Center to the Holy Cross Health and Wellness Center. The partnership expanded services at the downtown facility to better assist clients who are at risk or experiencing homelessness, substance use disorder, and behavioral health episodes. Today, services at Holy Cross included rapid rehousing services, parenting and financial literacy programs that promote self-sufficiency and family cohesion, diversion services to prevent homelessness, short-term case management to formerly incarcerated individuals, and outpatient treatment for substance use and behavioral health.



ADDRESSING OTHER NEEDS

Commitment to Health Equity

As part of our commitment to improving health equity in our community, Saint Agnes leaders, colleagues and providers came together for the MLK Health Equity Symposium on Monday, Jan. 16, to celebrate the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and recognize the ways in which his vision and tireless work remain relevant today – especially in the health care industry.

We were also proud to recognize two of our incredible community partners with the inaugural Saint Agnes Community Partner Award for their contributions to health equity and bridging gaps for minority communities. Congratulations to Shantay Davies-Balch, CEO of BLACK Wellness & Prosperity Center, and Genoveva Islas, Executive Director of Cultiva La Salud, for critical work in supporting our communities in greatest need.

Healthier Living Chronic Disease Self-Management Education

Health literacy and peer support are vital to the overall health of individuals. Saint Agnes continues its involvement and support for a community centered and integrated focus on health, healthy choices, wellness, and prevention. Saint Agnes invested \$4,826 in Chronic Disease Self-Management Education (CDSME), peer support and counseling sessions for its community members. CDSME programs provide older adults and adults with disabilities with education and tools to help them better manage chronic conditions such as diabetes, heart disease, arthritis, chronic pain, and depression.

ADDRESSING OTHER NEEDS

Blood Drive

Roughly once a quarter, Saint Agnes hosts on-campus blood drives with our partners at Central California Blood Center. Typically, we host a drive at The Plaza on a Thursday and then one at the hospital on a Friday, that way we are able to include colleagues from multiple areas. We don't have any recent stats or photos available. Typically, 20-30 colleagues will donate at each drive. We did include an article about our partnership with CCBC in our spring issue of the Healthy Spirit Magazine which is sent to patients 2-3 times per year.

Breast Milk Drive

As Fresno County's only Baby-Friendly Hospital, we take our babies' (and our mommies') care seriously, which is why the Saint Agnes Medical Center and Mothers' Milk Bank hosted the Central Valley Breast Milk Drive to give our Valley's tiniest infants the best start in life through the provision of human breast milk. With the donation of mother's frozen milk, we were able to provide the essential nutrients for babies in need to survive. Every precious drop counts to help babies thrive during times of uncertainty.
